The Clay County Board of Supervisors met at the Courthouse, Clay Center, Nebraska on August 26, 2025 at 9:00 A.M., as per public notice given in the Clay County News on August 20, 2025 a copy of the proof of publication being on file in the County Clerk's Office. Availability of the agenda was communicated in advance notice of the meeting. All of the proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Chairman L. Wayne Johnson stated that the open meeting law poster is posted on the west wall in the back of the room and presided with roll call showing the following present: Scott Bitterman, Eric Samuelson, Glen Becker, James Pavelka, Jesse Mohnike and L. Wayne Johnson; Absent: Richard Shaw.

All present stood for the Pledge of Allegiance.

There was no public input.
